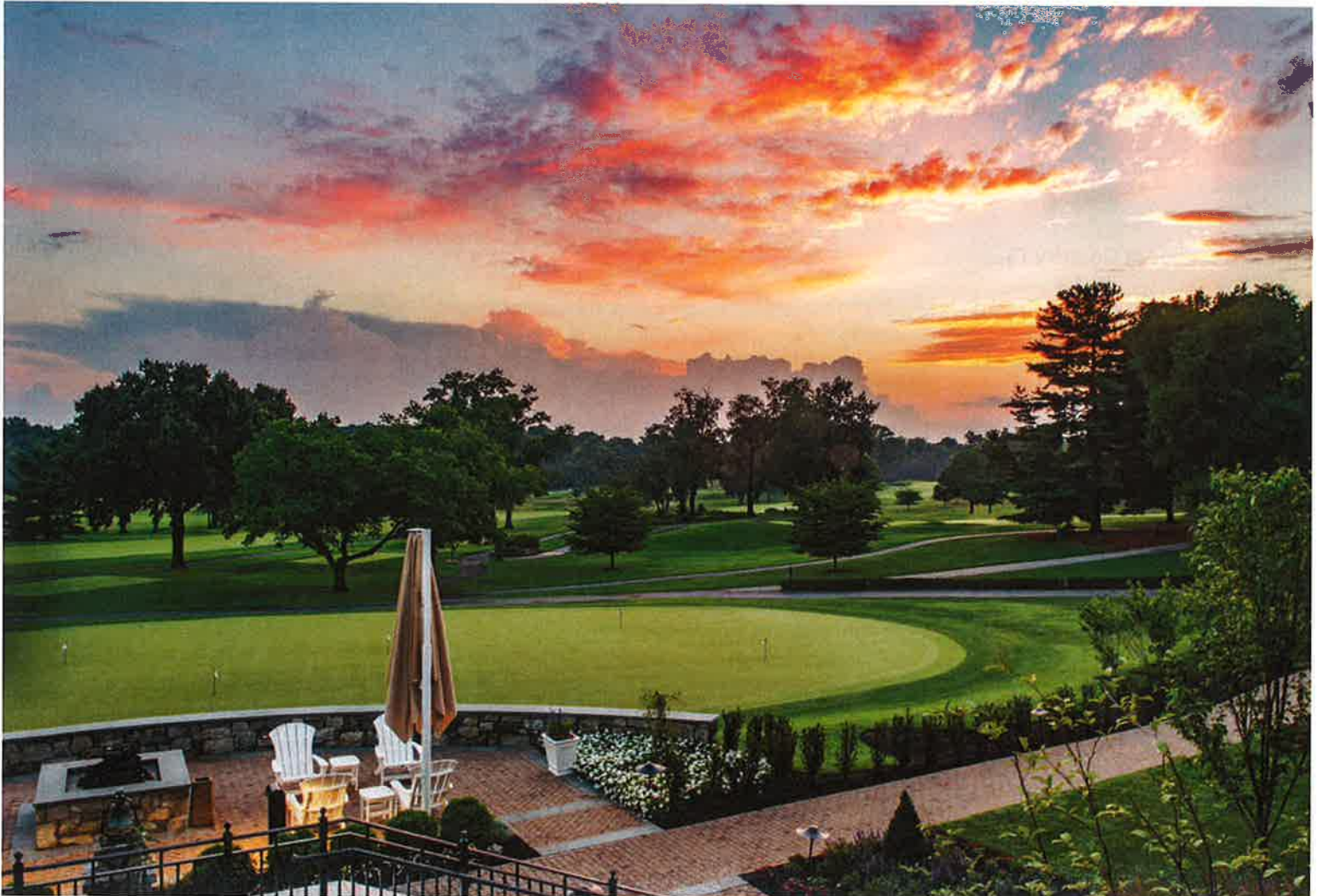

On November 3, 2017, the USGA announced Woodmont Country Club as its choice to host the 2020 U.S. Women's Amateur Championship, bringing it back to the nation's capital for the third time. About Woodmont Country Club

A short drive down the tree-lined driveway from Rockville Pike brings members and guests to Woodmont Country Club - a private, member-owned Club in an idyllic setting offering the very best in dining, golf, tennis, swimming, fitness, and good fellowship. Members think of Woodmont as their home away from home for themselves and their families, and as the perfect place for entertaining guests.

Woodmont Country Club was founded in 1913 as the Washington Suburban Club on leased property off Georgia Avenue in Washington, DC. In 1922, the Club moved to a site in Bethesda, MD - now the home of the National Institutes of Health. In 1950, the Club and its North Course opened at its current location in Rockville, MD.

The North Course was designed and constructed by Architect Alfred Tull with input from Woodmont member, Leopold Freudberg and Greens Superintendent, Rudy Will. In 1961, the second 18-hole course (South Course) was completed. In 2007, Architect Arthur Hills oversaw the work of rebuilding all 18 greens on the North Course. In 2018, the 18th hole on the North Course was redesigned, and work began to rebuild all bunkers, under the oversight of Architect Joel Weiman.

The Clubhouse has been remodeled and expanded numerous times. The latest renovation (started in conjunction with the Club's 100th anniversary in 2013) involved a complete overhaul of the dining facilities, a new state-of-the-art fitness center, an expanded ladies locker room and a new exterior.

Woodmont regularly makes available its facilities to military/veteran organizations, charitable and service groups, and youth programs. As one of the premier country clubs in the nation, Woodmont continues to serve its members with its world-class facilities, attentive staff and long history of excellence.

All supporters will be invited to play in a private tournament in May 2020 with special guest, 2005 U.S. Women's Amateur Champion and Woodmont member, Morgan Pressel. In 2001, as a 12-year-old, Morgan became the youngest player to qualify for the U.S. Women's Open and in 2005, was runner-up as an amateur. In 2007, she became the youngest winner of an LPGA Major Championship. Morgan continues to be one of the top players on the LPGA tour.
